DAY 1 - Rivers of Steel Explorer

Arrive in Pittsburgh in time for your afternoon on the water. Embark on the Rivers of Steel Explorer, the 94' green riverboat classroom for the interactive Environmental Science on the Three Rivers Program. Students will create and test hypothesis about the health of the river, providing an opportunity for discussion about river health, sustainability and more.





DAY 1 - Duquesne Incline

This evening, visit nearby Station Square along one of our three rivers, the Monongahela. Ride the Duquesne Incline to the top of Mt. Washington for sweeping views of the city and area. Take a tour to learn about the engineering aspect of the incline. Did you know that Pittsburgh has 446 bridges? Count as many as you can from the observation deck!

DAY 1 - Station Square

Station Square offers great student-friendly dining such as the Hard Rock Café and Buca di Beppo. Alternatively, Pittsburgh offers two Dave & Buster's locations in the nearby North Hills and Waterfront areas.

DAY 2 - National Aviary

Start the day at the National Aviary, with one of their many student-friendly experiences, ranging from bird encounters to programs such as Veterinary Experience, Birds and Conservation, and Science and Animal Behavior.

For lunch, stop by one of the many Eat 'n Park locations offering an affordable and enjoyable diner experience. Their student group menu include a complimentary infamous Smiley Cookie!



Spend the afternoon in Pittsburgh's diverse Cultural District, offering exciting shows, hands-on workshops, behind-the-scenes tours and more. The Cultural District is a 14-square-block section of Downtown that includes more than seven performance venues and 12 galleries. There are many weekday student matinees offered throughout the year, with a variety of tours and workshops available upon request.
